CAVU's Climate Innovation Challenge (CIC) kicked off at the beginning of the 2019/2020 school year and is designed to help reshape the conversation about climate change towards a more hopeful vision of the future. **The culmination of our project is a student film showcase that will be held on January 18, 2020 at the Bosque School in Albuquerque.**

In January of 2020 will we host a student showcase where participants can present their work to their peers, state and tribal leaders, adaptation and resilience professionals and organizations from across the state. All entries will be judged against the CIC rubric by a panel of scientists and media professionals. Outstanding projects will receive awards and be recognized and screened for the state legislature during the 2020 session.
